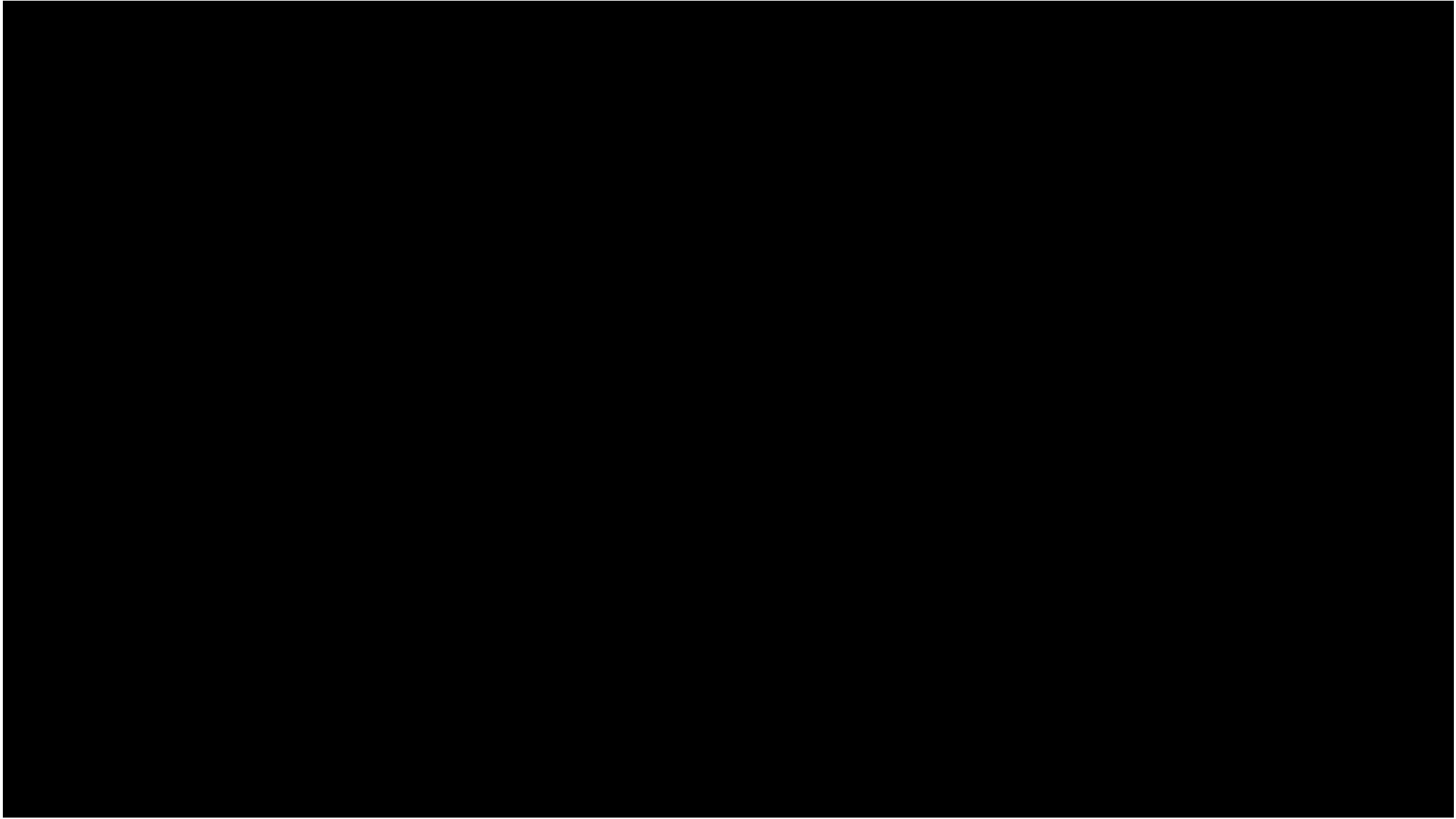


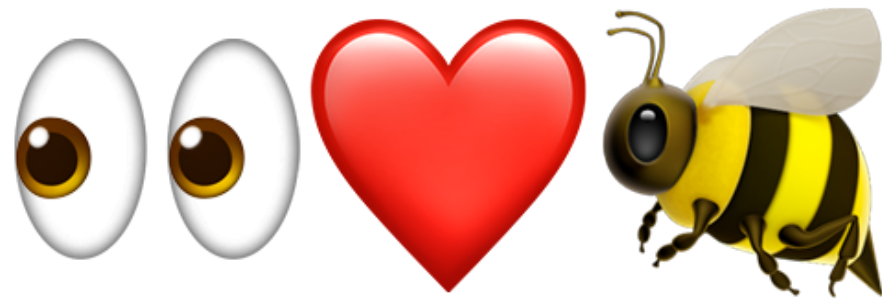

# Queen Bee

- 1 queen per hive
- Mates once in her life
- 3-5 year lifespan
- Can lay 2,000 eggs/day, fertilized or unfertilized
- Cannot feed herself





Worker

# Worker Bees

- All female, created from fertilized eggs
- ~99% of the hive are worker bees
- Many jobs over their ~50 day lifespan
  - House bees
  - Nurse bees
  - Forager Bee
  - Guard bees
- Capable of laying unfertilized eggs

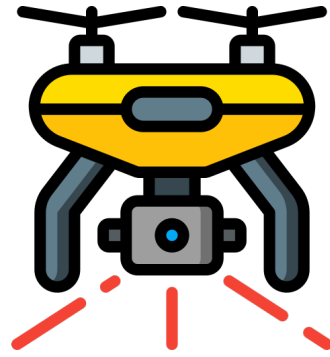

# Drone Bees


- Created from unfertilized eggs
- Single purpose is to mate with a queen
- Mostly hatched in Spring and early Summer
- Kicked out of the hive before winter
